In 2013, we launched a historic \$300 million **Vision. Innovation. Impact.** campaign to support Jupiter Medical Center's (JMC) strategic vision and transform health care in the region through top-notch physicians, state-of-the-art technology, modern facilities, and more. By October 2018, we had received more than \$160 million in donations. And in March 2022, we reached a remarkable milestone of \$300 million to support JMC's strategic growth.

This overwhelming achievement vividly reflects the value JMC puts on service to the community and the powerful dedication of friends, neighbors, and champions to help deliver the region's highest quality health care. Our goal has always been to ensure patients receive the same level of care offered at the nation's top academic medical centers without having to travel. Thanks to the philanthropic investments of many individuals like you, JMC continues to evolve into the region's pre-eminent health care institution while maintaining its independence as a premier, not-for-profit medical provider.

Because of the financial generosity of our donors, we are able to fund many of JMC's facilities and programs in its strategic plan. This campaign's pioneering gifts spearheaded projects such as the Anderson Family Cancer Institute, the Timothy and Jayne Donahue Cardiac Surgery Program, the Johnny and Terry Gray Surgical Institute, the Robson Heart and Vascular Institute, the Mastroianni Family Pediatric Emergency Department, the James J. Felcyn and Louise Brien Felcyn Observation Unit, the Tansky Concierge Suites, the De George Pediatric Unit in partnership with Nicklaus Children's Hospital, the Cary Grossman Health and Wellness Center, the Calcagnini Center for Mindfulness, and more. Here is a closer look at the successes of the campaign.

2015

FLORENCE A. DE GEORGE PAVILION

In January 2015, thanks to a landmark gift from the Florence A. and Lawrence J. De George Charitable Trust, JMC opened the \$46 million Florence A. De George Pavilion, an 85,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art tower with 44 patient rooms. The tower includes an entire floor dedicated to the Anderson Family Orthopedic & Spine Center, as well as the Florence A. De George Children's and Women's Services obstetrics unit with eight labor rooms, 14 postpartum rooms, and two operating suites. The opening of this new unit enabled JMC to grow its women's and children's services, which provide expert care for mother and baby in a state-of-the-art environment that includes all the comforts of home.

ANDERSON FAMILY ORTHOPEDIC & SPINE CENTER

Opened in January 2015, the center was designed to provide seamless continuity of care as patients transition from surgery to recovery and rehabilitation all in one integrated unit. Bringing the entire multidisciplinary team together enables greater collaboration in the care of patients. Orthopedic surgeons, neurosurgeons, physical therapists, rehabilitation specialists, pain management specialists, and specially trained and experienced registered nurses all work side-by-side to get patients back on their feet. The center features the most advanced orthopedic surgery suites, 30 private patient rooms, an on-site gym for rehabilitation therapy, a family room, and a dining room.

Philanthropic investments in JMC have ensured patients' access to the finest surgical technologies available. Physicians have life-changing access to state-of-the-art technologies such as the MAKOpasty® RIO® Robotic Arm Interactive Orthopedic System for precision in partial and total joint replacement surgeries. Patients return to work and play sooner thanks to an advanced robotics guidance system for minimally invasive spine surgery, the Hana® table for minimally invasive hip replacement procedures, and the Spider Limb Positioner System. This caliber of specialized equipment is typically found only at academic medical centers.



MARGARET W. NIEDLAND BREAST CENTER

The Margaret W. Niedland Breast Center integrates diagnostic equipment, an MRI Suite, soft lighting, feng shui elements, and a tranquil healing garden into beautiful and comforting surroundings designed to enhance the patient experience. With the full continuum of breast health services housed in one location—from mammography to biopsies and positron emission tomography (PET) scan to magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)—the breast center enables the patient to experience seamless integration of preventive and diagnostic services, all under one roof.

When its doors opened in April 2015, the community gained an invaluable resource within the 26,000-square-foot, cutting-edge facility that houses the full spectrum of breast health and outpatient imaging services.

The center is named in honor of Suzanne Niedland's mother, Margaret, who lost her battle with breast cancer in March 2011. Niedland's generous donation funded JMC's purchase of advanced diagnostic equipment and the construction of the new center.

CARY GROSSMAN HEALTH & WELLNESS CENTER

In December 2015, JMC opened an innovative hospital-based health center for patients and community members recovering from injury, illness, and surgery, as well as those looking to improve their health and prevent disease. The Cary Grossman Health & Wellness Center features a spa-like setting with the only full-size, indoor heated pool in North Palm Beach County. With exercise classes and a wide array of rehabilitation services, patients can prevent illness and injury while receiving advanced health education and improving their physical fitness.

2016

DE GEORGE PEDIATRIC INPATIENT UNIT

February 2016 marked the opening of the child-friendly De George Pediatric Unit at JMC, featuring 12 pediatric inpatient rooms, two high-tech pediatric surgery suites, pediatric therapeutic services, and a children's playroom for adolescents up to age 18.

Executive Director of JMC's Women's and Children's Service Line Bernadine Crosson says: "In this atmosphere of depleting health care reimbursement, it is almost impossible to run a hospital of this quality without donor support. The availability of advanced technology and excellent care of our small patients is a top priority here at JMC."

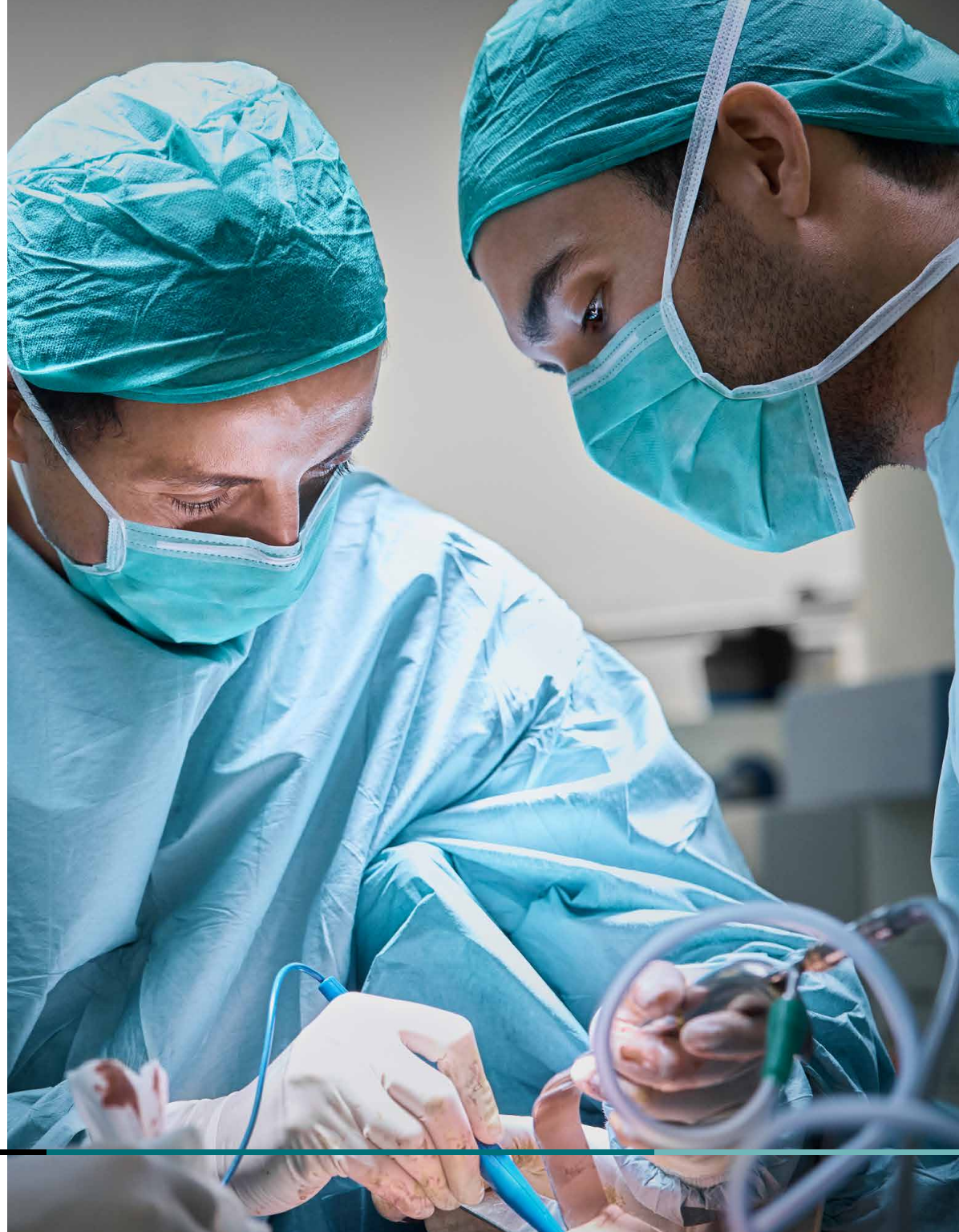
2017

FRENCHMAN'S CREEK DIGESTIVE HEALTH CENTER

Thanks to a lead gift from the Frenchman's Creek Men's Health Day Golf Tournament, the Frenchman's Creek Digestive Health Center opened in January 2017 to provide comprehensive care for digestive issues, including bile duct, gallbladder, indigestion, and stomach disorders. The philanthropic impact means JMC practitioners have access to an expanded unit that includes nine bays for pre-procedure and recovery, including two private rooms, four procedure rooms, and the latest new equipment for upper and lower GI procedures and pulmonary procedures.

CALCAGNINI CENTER FOR MINDFULNESS

Patients, physicians, and residents are fortunate to have access to the latest integrative medicine techniques that help them manage the stresses of everyday life through the Calcagnini Center for Mindfulness, made possible by a generous lead gift from Nancy Calcagnini and her late husband, Arthur. Opened in March 2017, the soothing 2,600-square-foot healing space complements JMC's advanced health care offerings with mindfulness classes and workshops. The Center has proven especially beneficial for team members dealing with the stress of the pandemic over the last couple years.



TIMOTHY AND JAYNE DONAHUE CARDIAC SURGERY PROGRAM

The Timothy and Jayne Donahue Cardiac Surgery Program launched in January 2019 with two state-of-the-art operating suites, allowing JMC to offer more advanced cardiac procedures and open-heart surgery. Since then, JMC physicians have performed more than 335 open-heart surgeries on-site and continue expanding the breadth of innovative cardiovascular services to treat such conditions as valvular heart abnormalities, atrial fibrillation, and aneurysms of the aorta. The impact of advanced cardiac treatments such as Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) for aortic stenosis, MitraClip for leaking mitral valves, the WATCHMAN for AFib, and minimally invasive cardiac surgery has been undeniable.

Two additional lead gifts to heart and vascular have enabled expanded cutting-edge treatments through the Robson Heart and Vascular Institute and the endowment created by

philanthropist, businessman, and JMC Foundation Board Member Leonard Abramson, in honor of his late wife of 65 years, Madlyn. His generous gift endows The Madlyn K. Abramson Chair of Cardiac Surgery.

“Gifts like these to the advancement of cardiac surgery create a lasting legacy that will allow cardiac patients the care they need close to home,” says Amit Rastogi, MD, MHCM, President and CEO at JMC.

Matthew Kolek, MD, Cardiologist and Cardiac Electrophysiologist at JMC says, “I treat patients with a wide variety of complex heart conditions. I know my patients depend on the highly specialized services available at Jupiter Medical Center to maximize well-being, safety, and quality of life.”

Dr. Kolek says he would not be able to provide the world-class, state-of-the-art care his friends and neighbors deserve without the advanced technology available

at JMC. “Technological advances such as jet ventilators, 3D cardiac mapping systems, and intracardiac ultrasound allow me to treat members of our community with even the most complex heart rhythm disorders, right here in Jupiter. Because of our partnership with Jupiter Medical Center, there is no longer a need for patients to travel out of state to receive world-class cardiac care.”

Dr. Kolek adds, “The overwhelming support donors provide to Jupiter Medical Center has had many positive impacts on our community. They have helped to ensure that our friends and neighbors have access to world-class health care. Their generous contributions also enrich the health of our local economy by bringing good jobs to our community and highlighting Jupiter as a premier place to start a business, raise a family, or live an active and fulfilling retirement.”

COMPREHENSIVE STROKE CENTER

In 2019, JMC launched a Comprehensive Stroke Center to deliver 24/7 rapid, advanced stroke care for both ischemic (blockages) and hemorrhagic (bleeding) strokes, with advanced facilities and technologies. The Center includes 3D neuro-interventional biplane angiography technology for diagnosing neurological abnormalities and minimally invasive endovascular procedures to repair these conditions immediately. This technology provides physicians with functional imaging, allowing advanced visualization and navigation around structures in the brain, providing better outcomes.

Juan Gomez, MD, Director of Neurointerventional Radiology at JMC, recognizes the campaign's impact in terms of what his team can now accomplish clinically.

“Our neurological team can now provide stroke patients with the medical expertise and most advanced technology to treat them quickly and effectively, giving them the best chances of returning to their normal lives,” says Dr. Gomez. “Meeting a patient in the ER with half of their body paralyzed and unable to communicate is heartbreaking. Then, an hour later, seeing the symptoms resolve after medical treatment and intervention are performed is priceless.”

Gomez adds, “Thanks to the generosity of our community, we continue to have the latest technology. This rapidly evolving technology is essential in our goal to give patients who are destined to be bedridden for the rest of their lives, the chance of returning to what they love the most. Time is brain, and at JMC, we make every second count.”

JAMES J. FELCYN AND LOUISE BRIEN FELCYN OBSERVATION UNIT

Thanks to a lead gift from Jim and Louise Felcyn, JMC opened the 18-bed James J. Felcyn and Louise Brien Felcyn Observation Unit. The unit is a setting for short-stay services such as heart monitoring, enzyme panels, and IV infusion for patients with dehydration. It offers providers more efficiency when triaging and managing everyone who comes through the door at JMC. The observation unit allows the medical center to provide the best possible care to all patients.

To meet the needs of emergency room patients who are being evaluated and tested over periods that can range up to 24 hours, a growing number of hospitals have created dedicated observation units like this one at JMC. By freeing the emergency team to focus on new arrivals and ensure the availability of hospital beds for admitted patients, such units help to improve care delivery across the spectrum.



MASTROIANNI FAMILY PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

The Mastroianni Family Foundation made the lead gift to establish JMC's Pediatric Emergency Department. The 6,300-square-foot department offers emergency services in a child-friendly environment. The unit features eight pediatric treatment rooms, a dedicated family waiting area, pediatric triage rooms to reduce wait times, and indoor play areas to alleviate anxiety. A pediatrician is always on-site. Pediatric patients have access to a team of pediatric-trained doctors and nurses equipped to diagnose and treat various medical problems. Since opening, the Mastroianni Family Pediatric Emergency Department has treated more than 17,000 children.

Cristina Pirez de Cardenas, MD, Director of the Pediatric Emergency Department at JMC, says that her patients' access to highly specialized services means families can get care without traveling far distances. "Parents can have their children cared for without being separated from the rest of the family."

In acknowledgment of JMC's continued response to the changing health care landscape, Dr. Pirez says she sees firsthand the community benefiting from the donations for pediatrics. "Our families rely on the knowledge that if their children or grandchildren are faced with a medical emergency, they can stay local and know the resources are available," says Dr. Pirez.

THE INSTITUTE FOR PATIENT & FAMILY-CENTERED CARE

Patient satisfaction and support for families has always been a top priority for JMC Foundation Board Member James "Jim" Perrella and his wife, Diane. Their generous gift enabled JMC to provide relationship-based care to create a healing culture and environment for all. Under the guidance of our Chief Nursing Officer, Pamela Canter, JMC focuses on maintaining superior quality and patient safety ratings while creating a stable, supportive environment for team members, patients, and their caregivers. A critical component of the JMC Patient Experience Institute initiative is advanced staff training to reinforce skills such as empathy, listening, communication, and compassion with best-in-class health care organizational development programs for employees and volunteers.


LEVEL II DE GEORGE NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT (NICU)

Made possible by the generosity of the Lawrence J. and Florence A. De George Charitable Trust, the Level II De George Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) cares for babies born prematurely, who are extremely low weight, go through a difficult delivery, or have congenital defects or illnesses that require highly specialized care. The 16-bed facility features advanced monitoring, imaging, and respiratory technologies for babies as early as 30 weeks of gestation and includes funding for extra postpartum and antepartum space.

Dudley Brown, Jr., MD, MBA, Chair of the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department at JMC says, “Having the Level II NICU at JMC has significantly improved the care my patients and their newborns receive. They have immediate access to the best neonatal care, providers, and services available, which has made a significant difference. Our patients have been happy and grateful to be able to receive this care here, close to home and family, and not have to go to other facilities outside of our community.”

“Because of population growth in our area and the growth of the services we provide both with the NICU and the OB Hospitalist program, the reputation of the Maternal Health Service Line has grown. This has meant a significant increase in our patient volume, which has tested our capacity. Thus, we will need to continue to grow the department to meet this increased patient load,” says Dr. Brown.

“We are grateful to all our donors for their support of the medical center, our department and our community. Jupiter Medical Center has been ranked ‘Best Place to Have a Baby in Palm Beach County’ for four years in a row. We have a culture of excellence. That, combined with improved facilities and cutting-edge services and technology made possible through donations, will be important for us to continue to excel,” says Dr. Brown.

TANSKY CONCIERGE SUITES

Thanks to long-time donors Rita and Burt Tansky, the Tansky Concierge Suites opened in 2020 to provide JMC patients with a unique concierge experience. Located on the top floor of JMC's patient tower, all seven suites offer luxurious, hotel-style accommodations, access to a nurse dedicated to the concierge suites, and a concierge coordinator ensuring seamless care. The staff of registered nurses is experienced and trained to care for every specific need.





CRISP CANCER UNIT FOR WOMEN

The 11,000-square-foot Crisp Cancer Unit for Women is a dedicated floor specifically focused on caring for female patients in the various stages of their cancer treatment. Constructed to deliver the utmost comfort to women and the people who love them, every detail was carefully chosen to facilitate healing and provide gentle reminders that JMC caregivers truly care. The Crisp Cancer Unit for Women was made possible thanks to a lead gift earmarked especially for its construction from former JMC Foundation Board Member Peter O. Crisp and his wife, Missy.

ANDERSON FAMILY CANCER INSTITUTE

The 55,000-square-foot Anderson Family Cancer Institute (AFCI) opened on the Crisp Cancer Campus alongside the Foshay Radiation Oncology Center. The AFCI facility provides access to cutting-edge, comprehensive cancer treatments and technology. With unique patient-tailored treatments, AFCI's impact is undeniably significant as South Florida's only designated National Cancer Institute Center.

"Cancer care is complex and multi-disciplinary. Through the generosity of our donors, the AFCI is equipped to provide cutting-edge cancer care to members of our community without being away from their loved ones," says Rogerio C. Lilenbaum, MD, Senior Vice President and Director of the Anderson Family Cancer Institute at JMC.

Through donations, JMC was able to add a new, high-performance, digital PET/CT scanner. This technological impact made JMC the first in the state to produce motion-free images that improve the diagnosis and treatment of cancer. The new PET/CT scanner includes

respiratory technology that monitors each patient's breathing pattern and stabilizes accordingly, leading to clearer diagnostic images and improved outcomes.

Dr. Lilenbaum says that cancer care is constantly evolving, and that each technological improvement leads to better patient outcomes. "The radiation equipment available at AFCI allows our specialists to deliver care with maximum benefit while minimizing complications," he says.

"The community has come to rely on JMC for their health care needs. Through its Centers of Excellence, supported by visionary philanthropists, residents of Palm Beach and Martin counties trust they will receive the highest level of personalized care," adds Dr. Lilenbaum.

He adds that access to clinical trials and newer therapies is core to excellence in cancer care at JMC. "The AFCI clinical research department is expanding the number of trials available for our patients," says Dr. Lilenbaum.

2021

NURSING

In early 2021 as the COVID-19 pandemic began to wane, Board Member Don McCree and his wife, Patsy, approached JMC's Foundation with the desire to support nurses. In response, the Foundation launched the McCree Nursing Challenge, where the McCrees would match up to \$250,000 in gifts. The goal of the challenge was to provide nurses with many benefits, such as continuing education, certification exams, access to high-tech tools for training, and award celebrations so nurses could receive ongoing recognition at a national level for the outstanding and compassionate care they provide. In May 2022, the McCrees generously sponsored another \$250,000 match challenge during Nurse's Week. In total, over \$1 million was raised to support JMC's nurses.

Pamela Canter, RN, BSN, Vice President and Chief Nursing Officer at JMC, says that nursing care is the center of all that happens at JMC. She notes that generous donors have supported the nursing team in many ways.

Canter adds, "State-of-the-art communication tools purchased through donations allow us to communicate more efficiently, not only with each other but with our patients' loved ones, so they know what is going on throughout their journey at JMC."

Canter says that donors have also generously given to support nurses in allowing them to receive advanced certification within their areas of expertise. "What this means for our patients is that our nurses have the highest standards, skills, and abilities in their areas of expertise, which contributes to better outcomes and safer care while recognizing their commitment to excellence in their specialty."

"As we expand our footprint in many of the newer minimally invasive areas for procedures such as TAVRs and atrial fibrillation treatments, we are able to offer our community procedures that are done via much smaller incisions. With this comes shorter lengths of stay, faster recoveries, less blood loss, and less complications—a win/win for everyone," says Canter.



PETROCELLI EMERGENCY CENTER

The Emergency Department began a significant expansion and renovation in October 2021, thanks to a lead gift from the Attilio and Beverly Petrocelli Foundation, enabling the construction of a new wing, including eight fast-track bays to assist patients with less-acute medical needs, thereby improving wait times, enhancing the patient's experience, and increasing the overall footprint of the existing Emergency Department. Recently named the Petrocelli Emergency Center, it includes advanced clinical equipment, spacious patient and triage rooms, a more functional layout for clinicians, state-of-the-art technology to handle higher patient volumes, and expansive waiting areas for loved ones. Today, JMC cares for more than 40,000 emergency room patients annually, nearly a 100 percent increase in patient volume. With such a large volume of patients seeking emergency care, the percentage of patients requiring intensive care has also risen. Fortunately, Frenchman's Creek residents are responding to that need and donated the essential funds to update and expand the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) to allow physicians and nurses to care for the most complex patients.

Vishal Gulati, MD, Medical Director of Emergency Medicine at JMC says, "Providing the highest standards in quality emergency care to our patients is very important to us, especially for anyone having a life-threatening emergency, for example, a stroke or heart attack. Our patients can find comfort in knowing they are well cared for and have access to world-class care as a result of their generous donations."

Dr. Gulati notes several clinical impacts he has personally experienced. "Physicians, nurses, and health care staff across different departments work together to manage and treat complex medical illnesses. We have caught cancers that would otherwise be deadly if left unchecked, protected the lives of those affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, and continue to see marvelous outcomes in patients treated for critical illness."

Regarding the changing health care landscape, Dr. Gulati says that our vibrant and diverse community deserves an environment where we can provide the highest quality emergency care in the region. "The new 'Fast Track' area will provide timely and efficient acute care. It will help us navigate the complexities of a changing industry in order to fulfill the current health care needs of our growing community. Meeting the needs of our community remains a top focus for JMC and philanthropic donations are essential in bringing world-class care to our trusted community," he says.

2022

JOHNNY & TERRY GRAY SURGICAL INSTITUTE

A transformative \$25 million gift from Jupiter-based philanthropists Johnny and Terry Gray are enabling us to build the 90,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art Johnny and Terry Gray Surgical Institute with 16 smart operating rooms and two hybrid operating rooms, including a third DaVinci Xi[®] Surgical System for non-invasive robotic surgery procedures. The smart operating rooms will accommodate a wide variety of surgeries, while the two hybrid rooms offer surgeons the ability to transition from a minimally invasive surgery to an open procedure, reducing patient risk and equating to better outcomes.

The dedicated facility will also house a 5,000-square-foot sterilization department. Development of the Surgical Institute is in direct response to the significant growth of the community and corresponding patient volumes, with more than 15,000 traditional and minimally invasive surgical procedures performed annually.

“Construction of two new state-of-the-art cardiac surgical operating rooms and two hybrid interventional suites at the Surgical Institute will maintain our cutting-edge capacity for providing the finest and most current medical technology available,” says

Arthur Katz, MD, Medical Director of Cardiac Surgery at JMC. “This will optimize our ability to deliver safe patient care and offer the best cardiovascular procedural outcomes to our community, such as open-heart surgery, TAVR, and structural heart procedures.”

Meshach Cober, MD, and Board-certified General Surgeon at JMC, says it’s imperative to him and his colleagues that patients receive the latest and best treatments and services. “At JMC, we have the latest technology for minimally invasive and robotic surgery, which helps us improve our patient outcomes and results. Also important is the staffing that enables us to provide full care for emergencies at any hour.”

Dr. Cober observes that as JMC continues to respond to the changing health care landscape, its surrounding community benefits from the philanthropy received by Jupiter Medical Center Foundation. “Having access to world-class medical care close to home is a great benefit of living in Palm Beach County and would not be possible without philanthropic support.” Dr. Cober adds, “I, along with the entire medical staff, am very grateful for the support of donors to help us have the services, staffing, and technology that enable us to do a great job taking care of our patients.”



“The Johnny and Terry Gray Surgical Institute has been years in the making and illustrates our vision for the future. INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

The Intensive Care Unit (ICU) serves our patients in need of highly specialized and closely monitored care with the latest technology. Thanks to a generous donation from the residents of Frenchman's Creek, the ICU received a complete modernization. Every element of the design was carefully considered and planned to meet the needs of patients, families, and the medical teams.

New oxygen and gas regulators were installed in each room. Patients' rooms were also carefully re-designed to be aesthetically pleasing for patients and families. A new, fully enclosed medication room was built for maximal safety and the staff lounge was updated offering caregivers their own special space.

The ICU nurses' station was remodeled with a state-of-the-art electronic tele-tracking board to ensure staff has vital information at a glance, saving time and enhancing patient safety. Washing stations were also installed outside the negative-pressure rooms and a new Intensivists' office was created to allow privacy for charting and phone conferences.

All the upgrades and enhancements give providers improved workflow and the best atmosphere to care for patients and those that care for them.

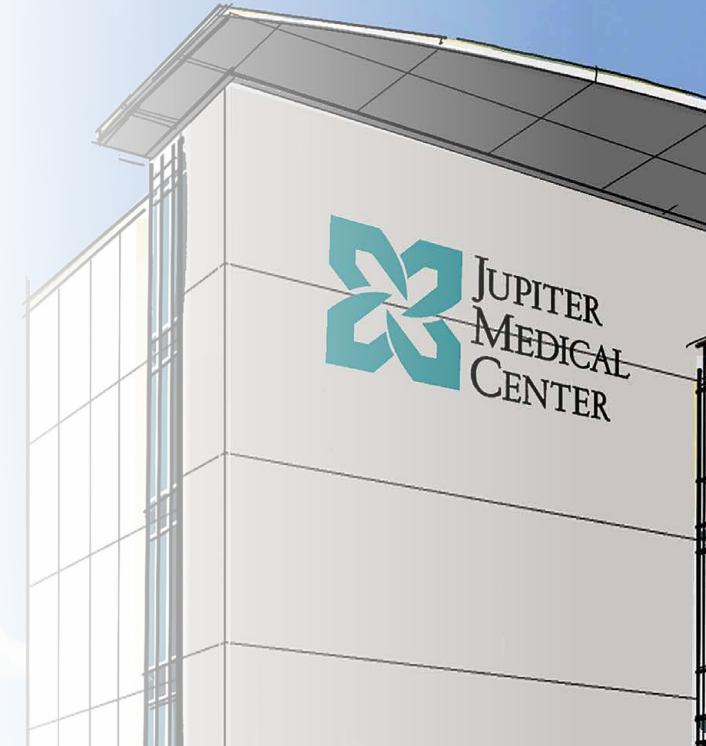

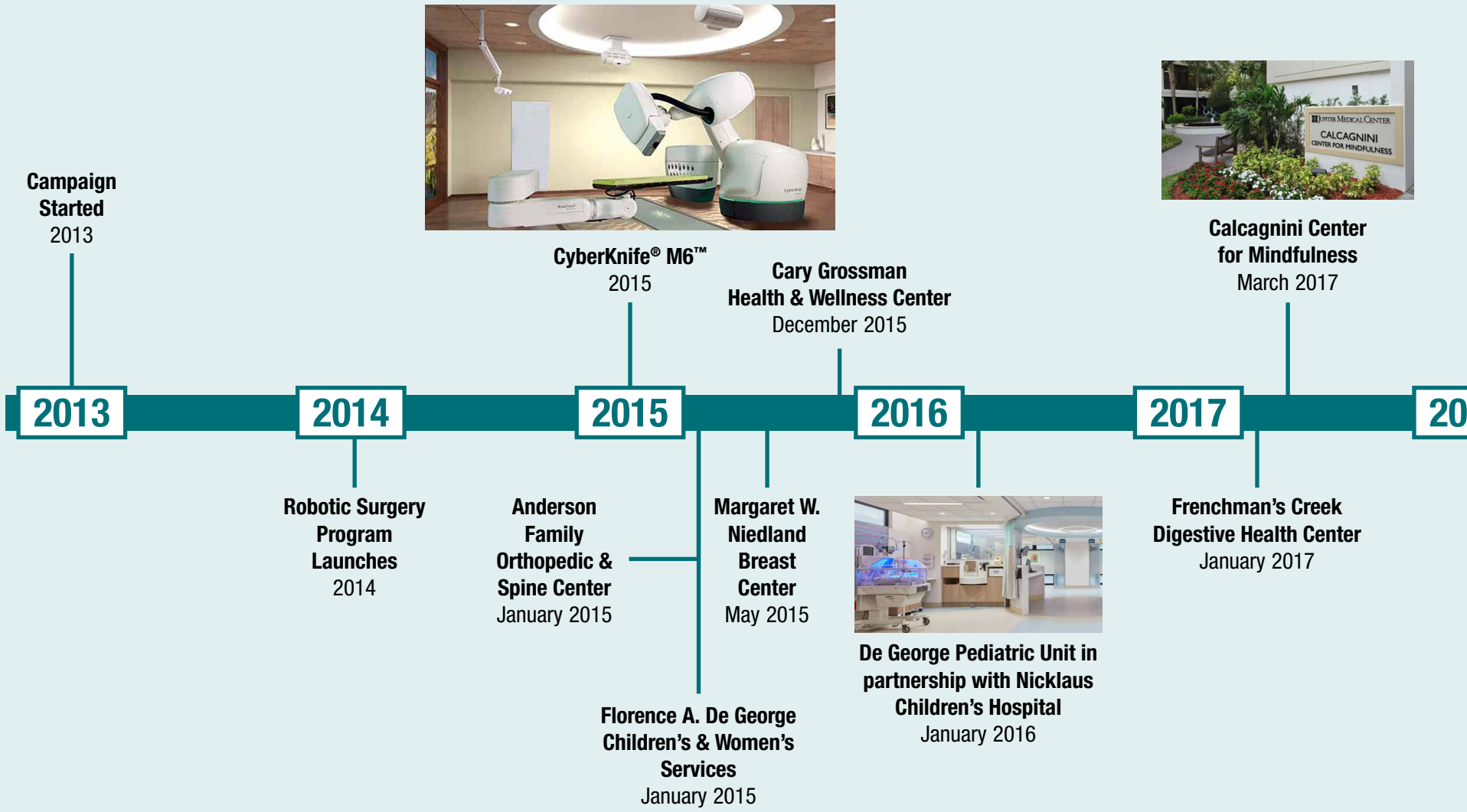
