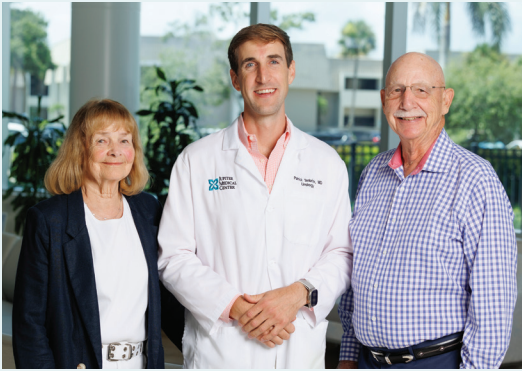

Welcome, Dr. Adam Nolte!

Adam Nolte, MD started at the Barb and Joe Charles Center for Urology in September 2025. Dr. Nolte is a robotic oncologist focused on treating kidney, bladder and prostate cancers. Using his expertise and the latest techniques, he performs minimally invasive surgeries for more concerning cancers in urology.

New Kidney Stone Treatment

Performed first in the region by Dr. Patrick Tenbrink, ClearPetra® is a new kidney stone treatment being used at Jupiter Medical Center that combines stone fragmentation with continuous suction and fluid circulation. The tube within a tube system improves visibility, controls kidney pressure, and removes stone fragments during the procedure, reducing complications and the need for repeat surgeries. Most patients can be left stone free after a single treatment, making it a safer and more effective alternative to traditional laser or shockwave methods. ClearPetra® increases the chance of removing all of a patient's kidney stones in one procedure while reducing the risk of complications. It's a unique new tool used to improve patient outcomes and decrease surgical risks.

A Novel Treatment for an Enlarged Prostate

Men who have trouble urinating because of an enlarged prostate gland now can take advantage of a treatment that

doesn't involve removing excess tissue inside the gland through sharp surgical instruments or lasers. Aquablation, offered at Jupiter Medical Center, is a minimally invasive treatment for benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) that uses ultrasound imaging and a high-pressure, laser-guided water jet to precisely remove excess prostate tissue without cutting or burning. The procedure is quick, incision-free, and typically requires only an overnight stay, with shorter recovery times and fewer side effects than traditional or laser surgeries. Patients often experience improved urinary flow, fewer urinary symptoms, and minimal impact on sexual function.

What's New in Prostate Cancer Care

There's good news for men who worry about prostate cancer — whether their concerns involve being diagnosed with it or undergoing treatment. Advances in prostate cancer screening and treatment are allowing doctors to better identify which men truly need biopsies or intervention—and which can be safely monitored. New biomarker tests, advanced PSA screening, MRI imaging, and targeted biopsies help reduce unnecessary procedures and lower the risk of side effects like incontinence or erectile dysfunction. At Jupiter Medical Center, innovative, precision-focused treatments now target cancerous cells more accurately, improving outcomes while minimizing complications and overtreatment.

First-in-Class Gene Therapy

Dr. Patrick Tenbrink was the first in the region to administer a first-in-class gene therapy for bladder cancer. Adstiladrin® is the first and only FDA-approved, non-replicating gene therapy for adults with high-risk non-muscle invasive bladder cancer. It is administered directly into the bladder via catheter once every three months, offering a treatment option for patients who cannot undergo or refuse bladder removal surgery.



Grateful Patient

Robert Kesselman, a 66-year-old Port St. Lucie resident with a long history of prostate issues and a family history of prostate cancer, was diagnosed with localized prostate cancer after his PSA levels rose. Uncomfortable with a “watchful waiting” approach, he sought care at Jupiter Medical Center and underwent NanoKnife surgery, a minimally invasive treatment that destroys cancer cells while preserving healthy tissue. The procedure allowed him to avoid prostate removal, minimize side effects, and recover within weeks.

“I’m pretty much back to normal,” Robert says. “It’s a great feeling knowing that it didn’t take months to recuperate from a surgical cancer procedure. Dr. Tenbrink was amazing. He got right to the point, he knew exactly what was going on. He showed empathy and sympathy, and his entire staff made us feel at home.”

In 2025 more than 1,700 urologic patients received care, and 659 surgeries were performed bringing hope, healing and life-saving care.
We are on track to treat 25 percent more patients in 2026.
